
And that's exactly why it is so important not to relent, to never give up, to get organised in networks, to create alliances and to stand up for a fairer world without violence, side by side.

# Counselling

In 2022, 55 people requested advice from Brava through various channels. After an initial interview and support in the triage, 36 of them were successfully referred to a specialised agency. 15 women received support over a longer period of time. 14 of the requests came from women in the asylum process, who were affected by gender-based violence (most of them during their journey). Four women had already been accompanied by Brava for some time. Those cases were successfully closed in 2022.

Persons affected by gender-based violence often have insufficient access to offers of support and counselling in Switzerland. They are confronted with structural obstacles due to linguistic or social barriers or because of their residence status that they are unable to overcome without support. They often don't know what specific offers exist. Brava tries to ensure that all people affected by gender-based violence will get professional support and counselling.

## Education

#### Trainings

In 2022, Brava conducted six trainings in gender-based violence for 160 professional experts. Clients included the asylum organisation AOZ Zurich, the professional association Avenir Social and the Salvation Army Bern. "How can I react in situations of domestic violence?", "How do I recognise that a woman needs help?" or "What contact points can I refer her to?" are questions that we always come up against during trainings.

Many refugee women experienced massive violence in their country of origin or on their journey. In Switzerland, they are discriminated against on various levels and often don't know what they can do or what their rights are. The staff at the asylum centres are often the only direct contact point and therefore play an important role in preventing violence and supporting persons affected by violence. In order for women to be professionally supported in the area of asylum and migration, the people working in these structures need to understand and be aware of gender-based violence.

#### Empowerment workshops

We held nine half-day workshops for 145 migrant and displaced women in 2022. The issues the women wanted to discussed ranged from "self-determination and women's rights" to "dealing with stress and prevention of violence". The participants of the workshops came from Turkey, Kurdistan, Syria, Somalia and Eritrea.

The aim of the workshops is to give information and help the women to get easier access to competent support. The workshops are led by two experts from the Brava Education and Counselling Circle and a key person with her own experience in migration or as a refugee. Additionally, experts like lawyers or psychologists give specialised inputs. Translations, child care and costs of transportation are, of course, provided.

### Political activities

In 2022, Brava and its allies attained that nationwide prevention campaigns against violence and prevalence studies on violence will become a reality in the near future and a contemporary sexual offence law will be introduced very soon. Furthermore, the path for a national crisis intervention centre in cases of violence has been paved and motions on this issue were adopted by both councils in the autumn session. At this crisis intervention centre persons affected by violence will receive immediate specialised medical and psychological support and will be able to make use of professional documentation and forensics services.

We are particularly pleased to witness that the fight for the rights of refugees and migrants affected by violence is finally bearing fruits. We are also hopeful for the political issues on the agenda: "Tatort Ausland" (access to specialised support for persons who were affected by violence abroad) and AIG 50 (better protection against domestic violence through a residence status independent of marriage).

But we need to persist! International experts confirmed in their GREVIO report on the implementation of the Istanbul Convention, which was published in autumn 2022, what we see in our everyday work: in Switzerland, there is a lack of political will and not enough money allocated to comprehensively combat gender-based violence!

## **Project "Voices"**

The year 2022 was very important for the project "Voices of refugee women". The first exchange between politicians and the project participants took place in January. It was the first time the women could directly speak with political decision-makers and voice their demands (for example concerning mental and physical health or their living situation in asylum centres).

A further highlight after our participation at the feminist strike on 14th of June: Tahmina Taghiyeva takes up the newly created position of Project Officer in July. This was followed in August by a trip to Berlin, where participants of the Voices-Project had the chance to network with refugee women from all over the world at the international Women in Exile conference.

Over the year, a total of 10 meetings took place with around 50 refugee women. They formulated their political demands together, supported each other and searched for ways to make their voices heard in Switzerland.

At the last meeting of the year the women wrote a greeting card to the new Federal Councillor Elisabeth Baume-Schneider, which included an invitation for a meeting. We were very pleased that the head of the Federal Department of Justice and Police (FDJP) accepted this invitation!

"Many people think that you cannot change anything without the right to vote. But as a refugee woman and activist I know that there are other ways."

## Campaigns

Just in time for the feminist strike day on 14 June, we published the brochure "Gewalt an Frauen – feministisch betrachtet". The launch was accompanied by a digital campaign on social media.

The richly illustrated brochure highlights important aspects of the issue in short texts: What is violence against women? What can we see when we look back at the last few decades? And what do statistics tell and what don't they tell? This difficult and heavy issue is made accessible through catchy visualisations, embeddings in everyday life situations and plain language over 50 pages.

#### 16 days against violence

Once again, Brava took part in the campaign "16 days against violence against women" by the peace organisation cfd. On 25 November, the Day Against Violence Against Women, we published a podcast on the issue of this year's campaign: feminicide. The planned screening of the film "Chaylla" at the Human Rights Film Festival in Zurich and the following panel discussion had to be cancelled at the last minute because the event venue Kosmos went bankrupt. The event will now take place in April 2023. Nevertheless, Brava was still present during the 16 days: with interviews in the media and expert inputs on various panels.
